## Free yard waste bag collection

Public Works provides a period of free yard waste collection during April (2 - 27) and November each year. Watch the media or check the city website ([www.springfield.il.us](http://www.springfield.il.us)) for announcement of exact dates. No stickers are required during this time and there is no need to call to receive service. Place your yard waste bags or containers clearly labeled "Yard Waste" in letters large enough to be seen from the street, in the area between your sidewalk and street. This collection is intended for leaves, grass clippings and brush/sticks the size of a pencil or smaller. Sweet gum balls may be placed in the trash, or may be placed in yard waste bags. Yard waste placed on boulevards or in plastic bags will NOT be collected. There is no need to call to receive this service, but if you have questions, please call the Office of Public Works at **789-2255**.
